RSV Is Not Just For Children

RSV infection can cause serious complications !!!

RSV is a common contagious virus that can cause severe infections, that may lead to hospitalization in adults aged 60 and older. People with COPD, diabetes, kidney disease, cardiac disease, and asthma are especially at risk. Symptoms of RSV can be fever, coughing, sore throat, runny nose, congestion, headache, and extreme tiredness. Most RSV symptoms are mild, but in more severe RSV infections, shortness of breath, extreme continuous cough. trouble breathing, and pneumonia can occur.

Some ways you can help prevent RSV infection are to: wash your hands, keep your hands off your face, avoid close contact with sick people, cover your cough or sneezes, clean and disinfect surfaces around you, and stay home if you are feeling sick. Vaccines are available for those over 60 or experiencing major health issues. As always, speak with your medical provider about the vaccines you need to stay healthy.

Breast Cancer Myths Only women get breast cancer. **FALSE**! Men need to be aware. If a man's grandmother, mother, aunts or siblings have been diagnosed with breast cancer, that man too is at risk for breast cancer. He should do self checks and speak with his medical provider.

Traditional Medicare vs Advantage Care

Medicare Advantage sounds good, but you need to know the difference between Traditional and Medicare Advantage. Private companies contract with Medicare to offer plans that offer Medicare Part A, B and sometimes D (prescription drug benefits). These plans often offer lower premiums plus more benefits than traditional Medicare. However. with Advantage Care programs you often have to get preapproved each time you go for medical care. The doctors you can use have to be in their plan/network. Many medical care providers, such as doctors, hospitals, physical therapists, home health care, and nursing rehab facilities DO NOT accept Medicare Advantage in this rural area.. When reviewing your Medicare Advantage, Traditional Medicare, Medicare D and/or your Medicare supplemental insurances, please check to see if your preferred doctors, pharmacies, PT, and nursing rehab facilities will be accepted by that entity.
